Accept Bids and Award Contract for Trash and Recyclables Collection

On a motion Greiner with a second by Sensenich, the bids for the Trash and Recyclables Contract were accepted, as follows:

• Waste Industries of Pennsylvania dba GFL Environmental

\$115.44 1st Year Unit Fee

• Eagle Disposal of PA

\$135.60 1st Year Unit Fee

Upon presentation, Greiner moved, Sensenich seconded to award the contract for Trash and Recyclables Collection to Waste Industries of Pennsylvania dba GFL Environmental @ \$115.44 1st Year Unit Fee, with the condition that, if the Borough determines, in its sole discretion, that the Contractor's service performance is not satisfactory, the Borough will have the right to terminate the Contract effective the end of the first year of the initial three year term with no further legal obligation to the Contractor under the Contract beyond the first year of the Contract. Motion passed unanimously.

Wilbur Parking Update

The property owners of the site of the Wilbur Chocolate Store, 45 N. Broad Street, are having problems with folks parking in their lot while visiting the Wilbur Market and Blackworth Grill across the street. One issue is that the Wilbur logo is the same on both sides of the street. The developers of the Wilbur have met the parking requirements for the overall site in accordance with the ordinance. PennDOT recommended closing the front entrance off of 45 N. Broad Street a few years ago, but the owners did not want to do that. The Borough cannot regulate private parking. The President, the Mayor and Yearick will arrange to have a meeting with one of the owners, Doug Bomberger.
